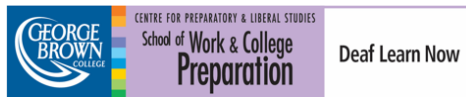

## History

e-Channel was launched in 2007 after the success of its distance and flexible learning pilot project in 2003. Initially, project funding was provided to three organizations, serving the Anglophone (the LearningHUB), Francophone, and Indigenous (Good Learning Anywhere) streams. In 2008, the College Sector Committee was funded to deliver ACE Distance, the online version of the in-class Academic and Career Entrance program. In late 2010, George Brown College received funding to pilot the development of an e-Channel program for the Deaf Stream. In the spring of 2011, the Coalition ontarienne de formation des adultes (COFA) was given the mandate to become the delivery organization for the e-Channel program for the Francophone Stream. In 2010-11 the funding for the e-Channel literacy initiative was changed from project status to become part of the program delivery of the funded e-Channel providers.
